News From Our Therapy Department

May is Better Hearing and Speech Month

Speech-Language Pathologists (SLP) evaluate and treat adults and children who have difficulty with speech or language, but did you know these two terms have very different meanings?

If someone has trouble with speech, he or she struggles with the "how to" of talking- the coordination of muscles and movements necessary to produce speech.

If someone is having trouble with language, he or she struggles with understanding what they see or hear. They may struggle with finding the right words to use or to how to organize those words into a meaningful way to communicate a message. They may struggle with being able to hold a conversation.

An SLP also treats people who have difficulty with swallowing food or liquid. The SLP will help identify what part of the swallowing process is making it difficult for one to eat, and then develop an effective treatment plan to safely manage different consistencies of food and liquid.
